

***Living in Covenant with God***  
Lesson Nine: Review of the Covenants

*As you begin to study each day this week please take a moment to thank God for fulfilling all of His promises in Christ Jesus! (2 Corinthians 1:20-22)*

This week we are going to review all that we have learned throughout our study of the covenants.

Each of the six covenants is represented by a chart that you will fill out with summary and application thoughts. This week's lesson is not divided into days so you can complete it at your own pace.

Below you will find a sample of the chart and an explanation of how to fill it out.

<b>Covenant Name and Scripture</b>	
<b>Summary of the Covenant</b>	
In this section you will summarize what you have learned by studying this covenant. Include the purpose of the covenant, how it builds on the previous covenant, and any other thoughts that help you grasp the overall significance of this covenant.	
<b>What Persists</b>	<b>What Does Not Persist</b>
In this section you will write down the promises, stipulations, purposes, etc. that still exist from this covenant.	In this section you will write down the promises, stipulations, purposes, etc. that do not persist and the reason (i.e. it has been replaced by a better promise).
<b>How do you see Christ in this Covenant?</b>	
In this section you will write down how Christ has been displayed in the covenant. How have you seen him as mediator of the covenant or as the promise of the covenant? How does this covenant reveal your need for him?	
<b>Application Questions</b>	
In this section you will find questions that help you apply the things that you have learned to your life in a theological and practical sense.

Do you view all of these as blessings from the LORD?<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>○ In what ways do you need to grow in your value for these things?</li></ul></li><li>● We learned in the covenant of works that God asks us to trust Him and His word over any other voice or desire. What are some areas of your life where you find it difficult to trust God's will and word for your life?<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>○ How can you walk in repentance and faith and begin to trust Him?</li></ul></li></ul>

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<b>God's Covenant with Abraham: Genesis 12, 15, &amp;17</b>

What does it look like to walk in repentance and faith? What are some strategies to help you grow in this area?</li></ul></li></ul>

<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>● In the Davidic covenant God says that He will be a Father to David.<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>○ How does that promise point us toward Christ as David's heir?</li><li>○ Is God our Father in the same sense that He was David's Father or in different sense?</li></ul></li> <li>● In Psalm 22:27-28 David acknowledges the true kinship of the LORD.<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>○ What does it mean for God to be King in your life?</li><li>○ What are some areas of your life where you have not completely surrendered to His rule? How can you actively give those over to Him?</li></ul></li></ul>
